TODAY'S INSPECTING OFFICER

LIEUTENANT GENERAL SIR HUGH BEACH KCB OBE MC MA MSc

Lieutenant General Sir Hugh Beach was born in London on 20 May 1923. He was educated at Winchester College and Cambridge University (Peterhouse).

He joined the Royal Engineers in August 1941, serving in the ranks until being granted an Emergency Commission in November 1942. He was granted a Regular Commission in January 1946. He served as a junior officer in a Field Squadron from November 1942 until May 1943 when he was then appointed as an Instructor to 140 Officer Cadet Training Unit. There he stayed until joining a Field Squadron of 7 Armoured Division in April 1944. He went to France in June 1944, was wounded and returned to England. Having recovered, he joined 6 Airborne Division in May 1945 and on appointment as Staff Officer Royal Engineers to 1 British Airborne Corps went to India.

He remained in South East Asia until August 1946 during which time he served in Java as second in command of an Independent Field Squadron and as Adjutant to the Commander Royal Engineers, 23 Indian Division. He then returned to the United Kingdom to attend a number of courses culminating in a 1st Class Honours Degree in Mechanical Sciences at Cambridge in June 1949. From the 1953 course at Camberley he gained his psc and in January 1954 was appointed GSO2 at the War Office Military Operations Branch. Completing a normal tour in January 1956 he then went back to regimental duty commanding a Field Squadron in BAOR until December 1957. He attended the Joint Services Staff College and gained his jssc in August 1958. His next appointment was as DAA & QMG 24 Infantry Brigade in the Middle East and in East Africa from August 1958 to October 1960. He was appointed Commandant of the Cambridge University OTC where he stayed until April 1963 when he returned to the Directorate of Army Staff Duties at the War Office, this time as a GSO1. Leaving the War Office in October 1965 he became Commander Royal Engineers to 2 Division until July 1967. From then on until December 1968 he served as Colonel GS at the Staff College Camberley.

In December 1968 he was appointed to command 12 Infantry Brigade in Osnabruck, Germany. From this appointment he gained a Defence Fellowship, studying at Edinburgh University until December 1971 when he was promoted Major General and appointed Director of Army Staff Duties at the Ministry of Defence. As a result of his published thesis he was awarded the symbol df and a Master of Science degree in Social Sciences.

He was Commandant of the Staff College from April 1974 to December 1975.

He has one daugher (Rosemary) and three sons (David, Michael and John). He is a keen sailor with a special interest in double-hulled craft, and also enjoys ski-ing.

He was awarded the Military Cross in March 1945 and the OBE in January 1966.

In January 1976 he was awarded the KCB and in the same month was appointed Deputy Commander-in-Chief United Kingdom Land Forces. He is also Colonel Commandant of the Royal Electrical and Mechanical Engineers and of the Royal Pioneer Corps.

THE PASSING OUT PARADE AND PAGEANT

This morning the College is to present a Pageant, depicting the progress of an Apprentice through the various stages of his military training, hobbies and sporting activities, from his first day to his last day at the College.

At the end of the Pageant, the Senior Apprentice Platoons are to form up in front of the saluting dais. The Parade Commander is Captain DM CHISEM RACC, College Adjutant.

THE FORM OF THE PASSING OUT PARADE

- 1. The Senior Platoons march on to the parade ground and take up their positions.
- The Inspecting Officer arrives at the saluting dais.
- 3. The Senior Platoons present arms and the band play the General Salute. (Spectators are requested to stand during the General Salute; Officer spectators do not salute.)
- 4. The Parade Commander reports to the Inspecting Officer.
- 5. The Inspecting Officer inspects the Passing Out Platoons.
- 6. The Passing Out Platoons march off the parade ground.

COLLEGE PERSONALITIES

LIEUTENANT COLONEL NS BRUCE RACC, COMMANDING OFFICER

Lieutenant Colonel Norman Scott BRUCE assumed the appointment of Commanding Officer on 20 February 1976.

He joined the Corps in 1953 as a national serviceman.

After basic training he became a physical training instructor, and within 9 months he had been promoted to the rank of Sergeant. He decided to become a regular soldier, and was commissioned in 1958. He has held varied appointments in the United Kingdom and Far East, and came to the College from 16 Bn RAOC at Bicester, where he was Second in Command.

In describing Lieutenant Colonel BRUCE's career mention must be made of his contribution to sport. He has played rugby 31 times as a Scottish International, 40 times for Hampshire in county championship matches, and in 1959 captained the Hampshire county side. He has captained and played for the Combined Services team on numerous occasions and has toured South Africa with the Barbarians, Canada with the Scottish team and Kenya and Rhodesia with the Combined Services.

MAJOR RA MABY RACC, OFFICER COMMANDING A COMPANY

Major MABY joined the Royal Armoured Corps as a regular soldier in 1951. He went to Eaton Hall Officer Cadet School and the RMA Sandhurst before being commissioned into the Gloucestershire Regiment in 1954. As a subaltern he saw service in Kenya against the Mau Mau.

In 1958 he went to the Parachute Brigade for a three year tour, serving in England and Cyprus. In 1961 he transferred to the Royal Army Ordnance Corps and was employed both as a Captain in the Parachute Heavy Drop Company and then as Officer Commanding of a Workshops Stores Section in Malaya.

He is now in his fifth appointment as a Major. The first two were in BAOR as OIC Technical Stores Provision in 15 Advanced Base Ordnance Depot and then as Officer Commanding 49 Replenishment Park Company. A tour as Deputy Assistant Director of Ordnance Services West Midland District was then followed by being Senior Stores Officer in Composite Ordnance Depot Hong Kong. Major MABY has been Officer Commanding A Company for a year. He has varied outdoor interests and is a keen sailor.

MAJOR DN FURNESS-GIBBON RAOC, OFFICER COMMANDING B COMPANY

Major FURNESS-GIBBON assumed the appointment of Officer Commanding B Company on 11 August 1976.

He joined the Army as a National Serviceman in 1959 and a year later went to Mons Officer Cadet School, and was commissioned into the RAOC in 1960. In 1960-61 he was seconded to the Royal West Africa Frontier Force and served in the 1st Battalion Sierra Leone Regiment as a Platoon Commander.

Major FURNESS-GIBBON transferred to the Army
Emergency Reserve and then to the Territorial Army
serving as a Training Officer in 52 Stores Company
RAOC (TA) Wessex Division. He returned to the
Regular Army in 1962 and after attending 48 Ordnance
Officers Course at the School of Ordnance was posted
to Ordnance Depot Aden as the MTO and subsequently
served as 2IC Stores Sub Depot. In 1965 he was
injured in a terrorist grenade attack on the HQ
Middle East Command Officers' Mess. Major FURNESSGIBBON has served as an ATO with CAD Longtown; as
Adjutant HQ RAOC 3rd Division; ATO Edinburgh, during
which time he spent 3 months in Northern Ireland on
EOD duties; SATO BAOR Ammunition Inspectorate and as
2IC of 1 Sub Depot COD Bicester.
