THE PASSING OUT PARADE 21st MARCH 1970

By kind permission of the Director of the Electrical and Mechanical Engineers and the Officers of the Royal Electrical and Mechanical Engineers, the Band of the Corps of the Royal Electrical and Mechanical Engineers will play at the Parade and later at the Prize—giving.

THE FORM OF THE PASSING OUT PARADE

- 1. The Band and Battalion march on to the Parade Ground and take up their positions.
- 2. The Inspecting Officer arrives at the Saluting Base.
- 3. The Battalion presents arms and the Band play the General Salute. (Spectators are requested to stand during the General Salute.)
- 4. The Junior Regimental Sergeant Major reports to the Inspecting Officer.
- 5. The Inspecting Officer inspects the Passing Out Platoon.
- 6. The Battalion marches past in slow and then quick time
- 7. The Battalion presents arms and the Band play the General Salute. (Spectators are again requested to stand.)
- 8. The Passing Out Platoon marches off the Parade Ground in slow time.
- 9. The remainder of the Battalion and the Band march off the Parade Ground.
