JUNIOR REGIMENTAL SERGEANT MAJOR GJ WOULDS

JUNIOR COMPANY SERGEANT MAJOR GN CURTIS

J/CSM CURTIS joined the RAOC Apprentices College in September 1969 and he is now completing his seventh term. His promotion to B Company Junior Company Sergeant Major was confirmed in September 1971, almost exactly two years after joining the Army. J/CSM Curtis has complete exemption in his EPC and exemption in three subjects of EPC (Advanced). In Regimental training he has attained both his RPC III and RPC II, and is therefore very well qualified for future promotion in the Army.

Sportwise, J/CSM CURTIS has represented the College in both swimming and water-polo, gaining his Colours in both sports.

Captain CURTIS joined the College in April 1970 and has carried out the duties of OC Training Company. This job requires him to organise and control Junior Leaders military training. Much credit must go to Captain CURTIS for organising some very interesting and unusual activities for the boys.

Additionally, he has had the responsibility of supervising unit messing, obviously done successfully when one looks at the rate of growth of the Junior Leaders.

A Corps standard hockey and tennis player and a very keen sailor and fisherman, Captain CURTIS will be missed in the College. However as he is off to America, on promotion to Major, for a nine month course, he would probably be reluctant to continue giving his services to the College.

THE FORM OF THE PASSING OUT PARADE

- 1. The Band and College march on to the Parade Ground and take up their positions.
- 2. The Inspecting Officer arrives at the Saluting Base.
- 3. The College presents arms and the band play the General Salute. (Spectators are requested to stand during the General Salute, officer spectators do not salute.)
- 4. The Junior Regimental Sergeant Major reports to the Inspecting Officer.
- 5. The Inspecting Officer inspects the Passing Out Platoon.
- 6. Presentation of the Meritorious Service Medal to WO 2 (CSM) Maule.
- 7. The College marches past in slow and then quick time.
- 8. The College presents arms and the Band play the General Salute. (Spectators are again requested to stand, officer spectators do not salute.)
- 9. The Passing Out Platoon marches off the Parade Ground.
- 10. The remainder of the College and the Band march off the Parade Ground.
