THE PASSING OUT PARADE, 13th DECEMBER 1969

Breastier G.V. HAYWARD, Commandant of REME Training Centre, Artonfield, Hampshire, is today's Inspecting Officer.

The parade, comprising eight platoons, is under the command of Junior Regimental Sergeant Anthony COWDREY.

The Passing Out Platoon are distinguishable by their white waist belts.

By kind permission of the Director of the Electrical and Mechanical Engineers and the Officers of the Royal Electrical and Mechanical Engineers, the Band of the Corps of the Royal Electrical and Mechanical Engineers will play at the Parade and later at the Prize-giving.

THE FORM OF THE PASSING OUT PARADE

1. The Band and Battalion march on to the Parade Ground and take up their positions.
2. The Inspecting Officer arrives at the Saluting Base.
3. The Battalion presents arms and the Band play the General Salute. (Spectators are requested to stand during the General Salute.)
4. The Junior Regimental Sergeant Major reports to the Inspecting Officer.
5. The Inspecting Officer inspects the Passing Out Platoon, then presents Long Service and Good Conduct Medals to Permanent Staff.
6. The Battalion marches past in slow and then quick time.
7. The Battalion presents arms and the Band play the General Salute. (Spectators are again requested to stand.)
8. The Passing Out Platoon marches off the Parade Ground in slow time.
9. The remainder of the Battalion and the Band march off the Parade Ground.

JUNIOR REGIMENTAL SERGEANT MAJOR A. COWDREY

Junior RSM Anthony COWDREY, who comes from the City of Cambridge, enlisted into the Royal Army Ordnance Corps in September 1967 a month after his brother, also a Junior Leader RAOC, passed out from this Battalion into Adult Service. His father was a Staff Sergeant in the RAOC during the war.

Junior RSM COWDREY has represented the Battalion at Soccer, Athletics and Boxing. Since joining the Army he has qualified as a Green Belt at Judo and turned out to be a useful .22 rifle shot. Recently he successfully completed a Staff Clerks Course and has obtained his Army Certificate of Education Class 1.

THE FOLLOWING MEMBERS OF THE JUNIOR LEADERS BATTALION PERMANENT STAFF WILL BE PRESENTED WITH LONG SERVICE AND GOOD CONDUCT MEDALS DURING THE PASSING OUT PARADE 13 DECEMBER 1969

Staff Sergeant Joe MADDEN enlisted into the Royal Scots Fusiliers in 1951 and transferred to the Army Physical Training Corps in 1953.

Between 1951 and 1953 Staff MADDEN boxed for the Army, Great Britain and Scotland.

After service in Hong Kong, Korea, Singapore, Aden and Germany, he joined the Junior Leaders Battalion RAOC in 1968 and quickly established a reputation as a most popular and efficient member of the Permanent Staff.

BATTALION DRUM MAJOR A. WILLIAMSON RAOC

Sergeant 'Drumme' WILLIAMSON joined the Welsh Guards in 1946 as a fifteen year Boy Soldier and became a Drummer. A year later, 'Drumme' transferred to the Corps of Drums of the Coldstream Guards with whom he took part in the Trooping of the Colour. 'Drumme', together with three other Coldstream Guards Drummers, once took part in the late Billy COTTON's Band Show.

Sergeant WILLIAMSON who has served in Malaya, Germany, Kenya and Aden, transferred to the Royal Army Ordnance Corps in 1965 when he joined the Junior Leaders Battalion as Drum Major. A great measure of the success of the Battalion Corps of Drums is a reflection of his popularity and experienced instruction.

Sergeant WILLIAMSON has recently supplemented his musical ability with a Class 1 Storeman's qualification.

STAFF SERGEANT P. SHERIDEN RAOC

Staff Sergeant Peter Sheriden, who comes from London, joined the Royal Army Service Corps in Aldershot as a boy of sixteen in 1951 and commenced his adult service as a Storeman the following year. In 1962 he changed his trade to Staff Clerk.

With the disbandment of the RASC in July 1965, he was transferred to the RAOC.

Staff Sergeant Sheriden has had a varied career serving in Malaya, Singapore, Germany, Jordan and Aden. In July of this year he was posted to Deepcut as Chief Clerk to the Administrative Commandant, RAOC Training Centre.
