THE HISTORY OF THE REGIMENT

INTRODUCTION

Articles written by officers who served with 161 Transport Regt RCT[V], later becoming 161 Ambulance Regt RCT[V] and finally 161 Ambulance Regt RLC[V], recording activities with which the authors were associated, have been published in various military publications in the past. This compilation of documents and photographs has been assembled in order to provide a single point of reference to the Regiment's 30-year existence.

The Regiment was formed in 1972 as a unit under the command of Central Volunteer Headquarters RCT at Grange Camp, Kempston, Bedford. It was one of the Sponsored units of the Territorial Army that were recruited on a UK-wide basis, as distinct from Independent Territorial Army units that were based in each county and recruited locally.

The Regiment's principal mobilisation role was to be responsible for the transport of military casualties across a wide area of West Germany between RAMC Field Hospitals in the Forward Combat Zone [FCZ] to RAMC General Hospitals in the rear area and for the evacuation of casualties through ports and airports in Europe for onward movement to the UK. This would have involved moving casualties by road ambulances between military hospitals and military ambulance trains to other hospitals or to railheads and airheads for evacuation. During the Cold War the mobilisation location of the RHQ was at Dortmund while the squadrons and their troops were to be deployed to RAMC hospitals throughout the Rear Combat Zone [RCZ].

The Regiment formed up as part of the Royal Corps of Transport [RCT] before becoming part of the Royal Logistic Corps [RLC] in 1993.

In 2002 the Regiment was disbanded at Prince William of Gloucester Barracks, Grantham, the home of HQ RLC TA, as a consequence of the reorganisation of the Territorial Army following implementation of the 1998 Strategic Defence Review proposals.

Throughout its existence the Regiment was always commanded by a volunteer officer of the Territorial Army.



1972-1977 COMMANDING OFFICER Lt Col JOHN SMITH TD

1972 161 Tpt Regt RCT[V] - Formation

Nov 161 Tpt Regt RCT[V] was formed under the command of Lt Col John Smith TD.

Upon formation the establishment of the regiment comprised:

- 260 Amb Sqn RCT[V] The sqn in its entirety was posted into the regiment from 160 Tpt Regt RCT[V].
- HQ 264 Amb Sqn RCT[V] The Sqn HQ was formed but personnel for the sqn's 4 troops had yet to be recruited.

1973

May RHQ 161 Tpt Regt RCT[V] and its squadrons trained separately that year.

260 Amb Sqn's Annual Camp comprised Week 1 in Stanford PTA concentrating on individual training. Week 2 was a road rally in 4 ton vehicles from the training pool, completing the circuit Bedford, York, Warcop [Cumbria], Cannock and back to Kempston, Bedford.

1974

Mar 161 Tpt Regt's annual camp was in BAOR on Ex Loadex.

RHQ commanded 2 Tps from 260 Sqn, 2 Tps from 263 Sqn [of 160 Regt] and all 11 members of 264 Sqn in BAOR. Base camp was at Minden. Ex Loadex involved the transportation of live ammunition stocks between the forward amn depot at Pomsen in the Corps area and the Base Amn Depot at Bracht, west of the River Rhine.

June A Tp 260 Amb Sqn camped in BAOR. During the first week the Tp supported the RAMC on a medical exercise at Olen near Antwerp in Belgium. Sqn HQ exercised the Tp during the second week. This included a demonstration day set up by 4 Fd Amb RAMC around the Mohnesee [the Dambuster's target] in 432 tracked ambulances.

1975

The Regiment's annual camp was held on Salisbury Plain.

- Oct An ad hoc sqn was formed to train in BAOR on Ex Spearpoint, the major Corps FTX which was trialling a new resupply system. This ad hoc sqn included elements from 260, 264 and 263 [160 Tpt Regt] Sqns who could double camp. This provided an excellent opportunity to participate in a major 1 BR Corps FTX and to observe regular units operating under field conditions.
- The return flight was overloaded either 10 PAX or the personal weapons had to be off-loaded. Because of the volunteers' civilian work commitments the decision was taken to unload the arms. The squadron sergeant major [SSM] with the PSI [permanent staff instructor] were off-loaded to guard them. The arms, the SSM and the PSI were returned to the UK 48 hours later.

1976

Oct HQ RCT TA and all units under its command, including 161 Amb Regt, moved from Grange Camp Kempston to Prince William of Gloucester Barracks, Grantham, Lincolnshire.

- Jan The Regiment was told it was to be given a specific war role from 1 Apl 1977 to provide casualty evacuation transport in BAOR in support of the Army Medical Services [AMS].
- Feb Ex Wintex 77. The RHQ was attached to HQ Dortmund Area, which provided an opportunity for the Regiment to study its new war role in a secure bunker. The exercise locations were at HQ [BR] Log Sup Comd, Rheindahlen, and the Joint Medical Cell [JMC] at HQ Rhine Area, Dusseldorf. It was the Regiment's first contact with the JMC, a tri-service unit, and it formed a relationship that was to be fostered and developed over future years.

The new war role was to provide and control casevac tpt:

- From Field [Fd] and General [Gen] Hospitals in the Corps Area to hospitals in the Dortmund Area {DA}.
- To unload casualties from ambulance trains in the Dortmund Area into Gen Hosps in the DA.
- To provide zonal casevac tpt within the Forward Maintenance Area and the Rear Maint Area [later RCZ] into Gen Hosps in the DA.
- Casevac tpt from Gen Hosps in the DA to airheads or railheads in the FMA/RMA or by road to the Comm Z for evacuation to UK.

As a result of the Post Exercise Report a case was submitted to increase the Regt's War Establishment. The Establishment of 161 Regt was subsequently amended to:

Peace:

2 x Land Rover Amb Sqns [260 & 264] and 2 x Coach Sqn Cadres [290 & 291].

War

Give up 260, 264 & 290 Sqns to come under command of 152 Ulster Regt RCT{V].

Retain 291 Coach Sqn and gain 2 x Land Rover Amb Sqns - 626 & 627 MCTG [Mobile Civilian Tpt Groups].

The Regt's task vehicle war establishment: $132 \times L/R$ ambs, 40×4 -ton TCVs [troop carrying vehicles], 48×55 -seater coaches, 156×12 -stretcher coaches & 13×12 -stretcher co

The Coach Sqn's top-up manpower was to be provided from the general army reserve.

The Ex Wintex PXR [post exercise report] formed the basis of regiment's future war planning and training.

1977-1981 COMMANDING OFFICER Lt Col BRIAN EMERY TD

1977 [Continued]

Apr Lt Col Brian Emery TD assumed comd vice Lt Col John Smith TD.

Within 3 weeks of assuming command Col Brian took the Regt on Annual Camp in BAOR. 260 and 264 Sqns were exercised by 152 Regt while RHQ devoted it's time to briefings on the new war role and recces of relevant HQs, hospitals, airheads and railheads.

1978

Annual Camp was held at Crowborough Training Camp in Sussex. In support of the CO were Maj David Coates the 2 i/c and Capt Roger Laing the adjutant. Commanding 260 Sqn was Maj John Lynch while Maj Eric Mitchell commanded 264 Sqn.

Maj Arthur Potton was OC 290 Sqn, Lt Chris Duffell Ops Officer plus a cadre of around 10 Senior & Junior NCOs.

1979

Annual Camp was in BAOR in May. The Regt participated in Ex Folding Bed.

290 Sqn's Camp in BAOR was liaising with the two MCTGs on coach operations. A trial conversion of a Bedford coach (the type with a rounded front similar to an RL) revealed immediate difficulties. No1 was finding all the right equipment for the stretcher conversion and No 2 was that the coaches were somewhat ancient and had never had the seating removed since they were built. Most were rusted solid to the floor! We were not allowed to play with their more modern coaches!

1980

The Regt participated in Ex Crusader 80 in BAOR. This was the largest multi-national reinforcement FTX since 1945. 260/264/290 Sqns were under command of 152 Ulster Amb Regt commanded by Lt Col Ned Falloon.

1981

Mar Lt Col Rick Ahern had been selected in January to be the next CO of the regt. In March he attended Ex Wintex in his then war role with 495 Movement Control Liaison Unit [MCLU]. However, half way through Ex Wintex he was directed by Comd RMA [Brig Brian Ridley] to spend the remainder of the exercise liaising with the Medics and to concentrate on Joint Medical Cell ops because changes in the med op plan were expected to materially affect 161 Regt's future methods of operation.

1981-1984 COMMANDING OFFICER Lt Col RICK AHERN TD

1981

Apr Lt Col Rick Ahern assumed command of 161 Tpt Regt RCT[V] vice Lt Col Brian Emery.

Col Rick counted himself very fortunate in inheriting a first-class team that included:

The Regt's new establishment was: Peace 35 Officers + 522 R&F

War 25 Officers + 887 R&F

Annual camp for 260 & 290 Sqns was in BAOR on Ex Folding Bed under comd 152 Regt.

The CO and his 2i/c visited the sqns in BAOR. This visit also included an R&R weekend liaison visit to 62 Sqn RCT at Spandau in West Berlin, travelling both ways on the Berliner Military Train and it included the military tour to the Soviet controlled Eastern Sector of Berlin.

Oct RHQ participated in the CPX Ex Plain Sailing in BAOR. This identified a need for 3 LOs [liaison officers] to be added to the regiment's establishment to run JMC tpt ops. These LOs were required to run tpt ops at both JMC Main [JHQ Rheindahlen] and JMC Alternate [Dusseldorf] and to liaise with RHQ 161 Regt at Dortmund.

1982

Apr The Regiment's title was changed to 161 Ambulance Regt RCT[V].

At the start of the Falklands War.264 Sqn was mistaken for reinforcements while it was en route to Marchwood! The Sqn had no direct involvement except for the impact on the Regt due to a total lack of tentage.

A consistent annual trg pattern was established:

Complete regiment:

2 x trg weekends at Grantham – 1. Military Standards and 2. Unit trg – usually a mini field exercise [FTX].

1 x Study weekend – this always included a Ladies Dinner Night.

1 x CCT weekend – a computer-based exercise on the Command & Control Trainer at Grantham.

1 x adventurous trg weekend [Ex Rick's Yomp] at locations including Capel Curig [Snowdonia], Sennybridge [Brecon Beacons] and Leek [Derbyshire Peak District]. The purpose of the Yomp was to "bond" the RHQ and Sqn management teams.

RHQ [supplemented by limited sqn representation]:

Year 1: BAOR CPXs - Ex Wintex in February and Ex Plain Sailing in Sept.

Year 2: BAOR CPXs - Ex Fastbuck in February and Ex Jog Trot in Oct.

All 4 CPXs concentrated upon military and political decision making in the event of an attack from the East [Orange Forces].

Squadrons:

Annual camp was either in BAOR or UK - heavy demands were made by BAOR for the sqns to support both Div and Corps FTXs.

Sqns also provided occasional weekend support on UK med FTXs.

1983

The pattern of training based upon the outline above continued during the year.

The Regt adopted the following policy:

- 1. The regiment's principal aim must be "to satisfy the customer" in the case of 161 Amb Regt this meant taking over all of the casevac tpt responsibilities [and problems] behind the Corps rear boundary from the Army Medical Services/Joint Medical Cell.
- 2. To ensure that the deployment plan was flexible and not set in concrete until the medical plan has been proved in realistic trials. Past experience had shown that the med plot was liable to change considerably after being thoroughly tested.
- 3. To make good friends with the medical services; they are very influential allies who "punch well above their weight" in any representations up the chain of command.

1984--1987 COMMANDING OFFICER Lt Col ROB WALTERS

1984 Lt Col Rob Walters succeeded Lt Col Rick Ahern as CO. Starting with Ex Crusader in 1980, there had been a succession of major Corps level exercises in BAOR which reflected the heightened international tension between the Warsaw Pact and NATO.

Following the death of President Breznev, the leader of the Soviet Union, in Nov 1982 exercises such as Red Claymore, Spearpoint and Javelin were followed by Ex Lionheart in 1984. This was another large scale multi-national reinforcement exercise. RHQ was again based in the cellars of Block 26 in West Riding Barracks, Dortmund. The two Coach Amb Sqns, 290 and 291 together with 260 Amb Sqn were under command, while 264 Amb Sqn once again came under command of 152 (U) Amb Regt RCT, its wartime chain of command.

Other, regimental activities included the highly successful "Rick's Yomp" annual leadership weekends. The Regt deployed to locations right across England and Wales for all of these exercises.

1985

Annual Camp was in BAOR in Oct on Ex Quarter Final. Rick's Yomp 3 was held in the Peak District.

1986

Annual Camp was held in October and was based at Ripon, in North Yorkshire. Ex Rick's Yomp was held as was the usual pattern of week end training.

1987--1990 COMMANDING OFFICER LT COL DAVID MEAD TD

1987

Apr Lt Col David Mead assumed command vice Lt Col Rob Walters.

Col David had Maj Tony Davies as 2ic and Maj Roger Laing as Ops Major. Annual Camp was based in BAOR at Dortmund.

260 (Maj Andrew Boulton & 264 Maj David Montgomery exercised on Salisbury Plain with 152 Regt.

The highly successful series of "Rick's Yomp" leadership exercises continued and was supplemented by the "Warm Front" series of weekend deployment exercises in role, utilizing real locations such as railheads and seaports.

The Regt continued to work closely with AMS [Army Medical Services] for planning and joint training at hospitals/dressing stations/railheads and over this period a series of presentations were delivered to major RAMC locations around the UK on the logistics of the BAOR model of casevac.

1988

264 Sqn trained in BAOR Firstly, the LSL taking its vehicles refused to take the Sqn's WRACs, which meant they had to fly out. Secondly, spare parts for its then ancient series IIa Land Rover Ambulances were no longer scaled in BAOR and the L/Rs had a rash of half shaft failures. The OC spent much of the exercise visiting most of the ordnance depots sourcing spares. Thirdly, the exercise (along with the whole of northern Germany came to a complete halt because of snow and temperatures as low as -30deg C.

July The Regt's Annual Camp was based at Penally in South Pembrokeshire. Joint presentations were made by CO and Ops Maj to Field and Gen Hosps RAMC around the country. Ex Rick's Yomp was held in the Peak District. Ex Warm Front was based in Boston (Lincs) docks to practice casevac from an SPOD [Sea Port of Departure].

1989

260 Sqn was supposed to go to BAOR but it was cancelled at the last minute. At that point the OC was able to find accommodation at WETC's [Week End Training Camps] during the week but as nothing was available for the middle weekend he took the squadron home to his Peak District Farm for the Weekend! Adventure training and map-reading was the order of the day. The squadron camped in one of his fields with a cook house set up in a cowshed. The officers slept in a hay loft except for the WRAC who were in the farmhouse and the OC - who slept in his own bed!

In Dec 1989, just before Op Granby (Gulf War One), the Regt was tasked to brief the hastily assembled Regular Casevac Regt RCT prior to its deployment to the Gulf. The 2ic and Ops Major delivered a series of briefings to the command element of this hybrid

unit on the BAOR system of casevac, so that they could adopt and adapt it to suit the conditions in theatre.

The MOD had directed that no reservists could be deployed for this purpose and 150 drivers/NCOs were assigned from The Gurkha Transport Regt in Hong Kong to drive the ambulances. Fortunately, in the event, the expected number of casualties did not occur.


The Hon Col was Col John Smith, the first CO of the Regt – until his death in 1989. He was succeeded by Col Rick Ahern.

1990-1993 COMMANDING OFFICER LT COL TONY DAVIES TD

1990 Lt Col Tony Davies succeeded Lt Col David Mead as CO with Maj Roger Laing as 2ic. Col Rick Ahern continued as Hon Col. The Regt's Staff List is in Appendix D.

There were no regimental annual camps in BAOR during this period, but joint training increased with AMS TA units. A limited number of personnel began to deploy to Cyprus and Bosnia as individual reinforcements.

There were also major structural changes to the orbat of the RCT TA and a number of regiments were disbanded. 161 Amb Regt was due to be disbanded but, fortunately, was given a last-minute reprieve.

Ex Winter Saviour with 254 (Cambridge) Fd Ambulance – 24/25 March Ex Warm Front at Retford – 19/20 May

Ex Ricks Yomp in the Brecon Beacons based at Crickhowell Trg. Centre – 08/09Sept

260 Sqn's Annual camp was at Nescliffe. 264 and 291 Sqns trained on Ex Starlight Ride at Seighton Camp, Chester – 06/07 October

23 June/07 July Annual Camp, less 260 Sqn, undertook Individual Military Training.

In the summer of 1990 Maj Gen Colin Carrington convened a briefing of Honorary Colonels of TA Regiments and Squadrons at HQ RCT TA, Grantham.

Annual Camp (RHQ, 290,291, 264,260, REME Wksp.) - 29 June/14 July. The Regt deployed initially to Swinerton Training Area (originally the old ordinance factory, still complete with 20MM cannon shells and some very suspect and potentially dangerous buildings!) The Regt ran special to role and military training on the training area and surrounds. Recovery to Grantham was staged through Seighton Camp, Chester.

Ex Rick's Yomp was held in October.

The Regt used 260 Sqn OC's farm as a base for adventure training with the Squadrons rotating though it for an overnight stay.

Routine standards and military training weekends continued.

In December the government announced a reorganisation of the Territorial Army. Under the initial plans the effects on the Regt and its sqns of the reorganisation were:

- 1. RHQ Future yet to be decided
- 2. HQ Sqn, 260 Sqn & 264 Sqn to be disbanded
- 3. 290 Sqn & 291 Sqn to be retained at increased strength.


1992

In 1992 the Regt took part in The RCT Silver Jubilee parade at Grantham.

The "Rick's Yomp" and "Warm Front" series of weekend exercises continued.

In May the Regt deployed to Devon on in its final annual camp as an RCT Cap Badged Regt. 260 Sqn were at Penhale Trg Camp, then at Willsworthy. 264 Sqn were at Willesworthy (Dartmoor) and then at Penhale, 290 Sqn were at Tregantle Fort (Plymouth), 291 Sqn were at Willsworthy, then Fremington. The training was a mix of ranges, driver training and adventure training, culminating in a night exercise on

Dartmoor mounted from Oakhampton. The RHQ deployed initially to Willsworthy, then to the Tavistock TA Training Centre. The REME workshop provided support to the Commando Logistic Regt Workshops at Plymouth servicing their Snow Cats!

1993-1996 COMMANDING OFFICER LT COL ROGER LAING TD

1993 On 1st April 1993 Lt Col Roger Laing assumed command vice Lt Col Tony Davies.

Col Roger had Maj Roger Hood as 2ic. Lt Col Laing was the last RCT CO of the Regt, with the shortest tenure – just 4 days! With effect from 05 April 1993, the Regt rebadged to the Royal Logistic Corps and became part of the CSSG (Combat Services Support Group) UK.

Some 25 coach ambulances were issued from disbanding BAOR units and the RAF. This enabled the Regt to carry out an intensive passenger service vehicle (PSV) training programme to qualify drivers to the full civilian (bus driver) standard. During annual camp in 1993, the Regt became fully operational in this respect.

A small but growing number of personnel were deployed to Bosnia in support of NATO operations in that theatre.

HRH The Duke of Gloucester visited the Regt at Grantham and toured a fully equipped 12 stretcher ambulance coach.

Annual Camp was in UK to assimilate personnel from the disbanded 160 Tpt Regt and introduce them to coach amb ops and procedures. An FTX was held at Ollerton. The Regt established firm links with CSSG UK, based at Tidworth, and charitable links with the Lincolnshire Air Ambulance.

1994

Rick's Yomp was based at Capel Curig, North Wales.. The Annual Camp was in UK based at Wyke Regis, Dorset with adventure trg and individual skills practise.

1995

In 1995 Col Tony Stormer succeed Col Rick Ahern as Hon Col.

A small but growing number of personnel were deployed to Bosnia in support of NATO operations in that theatre. Four officers mobilised as part of Op GRAPPLE, the United Nations Protection Force (UNPROFOR) in Bosnia and Croatia. All continued in post as part of Op RESOLUTE, the NATO Peace Implementation Force (IFOR) which came into force on 20 December 1995. Those involved were:

Major George Stanford -Sector Liaison Officer based in Zenica, 4 Armd Bde-3 Bosnian Army - UN Turkish Bn, then Liaison UK 3 Div - Croat Div based in Vitez.

Major Matt Limb - HQ Split.

Major Mick Roche - QM Split.

Captain Simon Egan - British Liaison Officer to the French Army, Mostar.

Rick's Yomp was based at Leek Camp in the Peak District.

The Regt provided casevac cover for the International Air Fair at Fairford, Gloucestershire. The Annual Camp was in October.

The RSM was WO1 Alvin Ward – a future Captain.

1996-1999 COMMANDING OFFICER LT COL ROGER HOOD TD

1996

April Lt Col Roger Hood TD assumed command of 161 Amb Regt RLC(V) vice Lt Col Roger Laing TD.

Col Roger had Maj Gary Evanson as 2ic and Maj George Stanford as Ops Major.

The vibrant, 90% manned, effective regiment was operationally ready and an asset of CCSG(UK) a 5,000 strong brigade based in Aldershot commanded by Brig Tim Cross CBE of both regular and reserve units. CO 161 Regt was the Comd Med's casevac adviser within HQ CSSG(UK) which itself has a global Ace Rapid Reaction Corps role, ARRC. [*a Combat Service Support Group with a mirror group based in Germany, CSSG(G) supported by 152 Amb Regt(V) in Belfast]

161 Regt had an establishment of 136 coach ambulances and regularly practised with about 24 based in Grantham, either with stretcher fits or seats for its 290 and 291 Sqns plus some 30 Land Rover ambulances used for exercises. The Regt's establishment was 335 with 284 soldiers – a manning ratio of 90%.

161 Amb Regt RLC is acknowledged by the MOD.,4 Div and CSSG as the mass casualty evacuation experts.

1998

A series of CPXs on the Command & Control Trainer had been developed over several years by the then OC of 260 Sqn in cooperation with the CO of 254 Field Ambulance Lt Col John Hedges RAMC[V].

The first joint CPX exercise with 254 Fd Amb was Exercise **Duffells Coat** which was a UN Humanitarian relief deployment in Ethiopia. 260 Squadron was tasked to evacuate 254 Field Hospital along some very interesting terrain.

Ex Duffells Coat was developed and expanded into Ex **Duffells Revenge** which was a Nato Relief deployment into Azerbaijan and Armenia. At that point in time those countries were arguing over Nogorno Karagabh. The exercise was played with 254 Fd Hosp and the Staff of the Military Evacuation Train TA.

Ex Duffels Revenge was later developed into a major ARRC deployment exercise complete with shipping and aircraft arrival details called **Express Delivery**. It was played with the ARRC staff in the CCT at Grantham.

- Aug Ex Caucasian Refuge was war gamed in the Grantham Command & Control Trainer by Regt 2IC, Maj Evanson and RMO Lt Col Hedges
- Oct Annual Camp was training at Barry Buddon Trg Camp, Carnoustie, Scotland and convoy moved to Swynnerton Trg Camp, Stafford.

The annual Ex Rick's Yomp occurred each year and tested endurance, planning, map reading and helped camaraderie across all ranks.

1999

Apr Lt Col George Stanford assumed command vice Lt Col Roger Hood.

Col George had Maj Matt Limb as 2ic and Maj Tom Liddle as Ops Major. Regimental Medical Officer was Lt Col John Hedges RAMC[V].

Annual Standards Training was conducted at Folkestone. It was the first year that the new requirements for BFT/CFT came into effect with a four-mile CFT. During this CFT the Regiment suffered the sad loss of Dvr George Humphreys who succumbed to a heart attack. A full enquiry ensued and the loss was put down to a sad accident. A military funeral held in Middleborough attended by Lt Col Stanford and Major Matt Limb.

Petit Mash exercises continued as in previous years at Saighton Camp, Chester.

Adventurous Training (Battlefield Tour) was conducted in France (Ex Ricks Yomp).

The Regiment decided that the term "Annual Camp" would cease to be used and instead a more military phrase "Annual Deployment Exercise – ADE" would be used. The ADE was held at Penhale Camp, Cornwall. During this 15day period a combined exercise was held with the Newquay Coast Guard (Ex SANDCLIFF) involving the casevac and treatment of injured walkers/climbers.

A selection of documents relating to service in the Regt at this time is attached at Appendix B

2000

Annual Standards Training was conducted at Strensall.

The normal 3 x Petit Mash Exercises were conducted at Saighton Camp in support of the RAMC.

A Staff Ride (Battlefield Tour) to Ypres, Belgium was undertaken. Dr Peter Caddick-Adams from the Cranfield Institute was hired as our historian and staff ride leader.

The Annual Deployment Exercises were held in support Ex STRONG VIRGINIAN, a 2 Log Sp Gp exercise.

The second, and main ex, was Ex AUTUMN AMBULANCE. This was preceded by a Command Post Exercise [CPX] in Grantham's CCT [computer] trainer. The aim of the main ADE was to exercise C³ of the deployed Evacuation Control Centre (ECC) and ASG during mobilisation, FTXs and redeployment. The Ex was intended to simulate the sp of a UK Div deployed in sp of a NATO multi-national war fighting operation. Multiple sites were selected to enable the build and collapse of the ECC (161 RHQ). As we were self-supporting, the Regt deployed with UBRE for fuel resupply. This was during the fuel strikes with commercial trucks queuing by fuel stations to refuel. Just next to them was 161 Regt with thousands of litres of fuel. Luckily, we didn't lose any of our stock!!!

Ex Ricks Yomp, Adv Trg, was conducted at Capel Curig. North Wales.

Ex CELTIC HAVEN provided the Regiment with the opportunity to assist 152 (Ulster) Ambulance Regiment with their CCT Exercise. The Regiment provided G4 sp to the exercise. Other units involved were 202 Fd Hosp, Amb Train Gp, 831 Med Sp Sqn, 165 Port Regt, 168 Pnr Regt, RMP and 4626 AES RAF.

A second staff ride was conducted, Ex AMBULANCE GARDEN, in Arnhem. We were lucky enough to take with us Mr B Jenkins, a veteran of the battle. A dinner was held in Arnhem with Mr Jenkins and the Dutch family of people he met during the original operation. Mr Peter Caddick-Adams continued his role as our historian and staff ride leader.

2001

Annual Standards Training was conducted at Grantham.

The normal 3xPetit Mash Ex were conducted at Saighton Camp in sp of the RAMC.

Ex Ricks Yomp, Adv Trg, was conducted at Halton.

Staff Ride (Battlefield Tour), Ex AMBULANCE OVERLORD, was to Normandy and surrounding area. Dr Peter Caddick-Adams was our historian and staff ride leader.

The Annual Deployment Exercise was conducted at Swynnerton Camp. The object of the exercise was to upgrade driving licences, plus individual and military skills. Also, with the impending disbandment of the Regiment, the identification of personnel and their proposed future units was carried out to ensure every member of the unit who wished to stay in the TA had a new unit to receive them. The ADE took place from 8 to 22 September. As people would know there was the catastrophic event on 11 September in New York with the attack on the World Trade Centre. This caused the security level to be raised at the camp - a very interesting period. Little did we know, however, that as a result of the WTC attack quite a few of the Regiment, albeit in their new units, would be deployed to hot spots such as Afghanistan, Kuwait, Iraq and Pakistan.

2002

A Staff Ride (Battlefield Tour), Ex SHARPES OVERLORD, was made to Salamanca and the surrounding area. Dr Peter Caddick-Adams, a historian, was the staff ride leader.

Most of the year was focused on ensuring personnel were received by their new units.

The Regt held a Disbandment Parade at HQ RLC, Grantham on 19 October 2002.


The Regt was disbanded on 20 October 2002.



SQUADRON HISTORIES

260 SQUADRON

The squadron was formed shortly after the start of WW1 as 260 MT Coy ASC. Its role was as an ammunition carrier for the British Expeditionary |Force [BEF] in France and Belgium.

260 Sqn reformed during WW2 in April 1940 as a Motor Ambulance Coy RAMC before transferring to the RASC in 1942 where it served in N Africa and Italy.

264 SQUADRON

The squadron was formed during WW1 on 4 March 1916 as 264 MT Coy ASC. It served with the BEF in France and Belgium.

During WW2 it was tasked as a Station Maintenance Coy.

290 SQUADRON

The squadron was formed during WW1 on 6 March 1915 as 290 Horse Tpt Coy ASC. It served with the BEF in France and Belgium.

During WW2 the squadron was reformed and attached to 21 Army Group,

291 SQUADRON

The squadron was formed during WW1 on 6 March 1915 as 291 Horse Tpt Coy ASC. It served with the BEF in France and Belgium.

During WW2 the squadron was reformed as 291 Coy and served with 16 Div Pet.

The squadron histories have been taken from records held by the RLC Museum.




I am sure with the continued support and hard work of all members of the Regiment we will continue to move from strength to strength.





161 AMBULANCE REGIMENT RLC(V)

161 Ambulance Regiment, Royal Logistic Corps (Volunteers) plays a vital role in the medical orbat within the CSSG (UK). Originally raised in 1973 as a Specialist Regiment of the Royal Corps of Transport TA, it fulfilled the 4th line casevac role in the RCZ, in what was BAOR.

Re-formed in April 1993, on the inception of the Royal Logistic Corps and based at HQ RLC TA in Grantham, the Regiment is tasked with the movement of casualties from Field Hospitals in both the FSG and RSG areas of operations, either to railheads or airheads for rearward evacuation to the UK base, or directly by road to field hospitals with specialist facilities in CSSG (UK) or CSSG (A).

The Regiment consists of RHQ with workshops detachment and two ambulance squadrons; 290 Squadron and 291, each with an establishment of 177 all ranks, capable of manning 45 x 10 metre coaches and 23 x 12 metre coaches. Each coach can be converted to carry stretcher bound patients in two tiers along each side of the coach.

Though being primarily an ambulance coach regiment, 161 Ambulance Regiment RLC(V) personnel have retained the skills necessary for the provision of 2nd line casualty evacuation using landrover ambulances in more demanding field conditions.

Furthermore 161 Ambulance Regiment is also able to undertake the evacuation of persons considered at risk in stations and territories overseas, or assist in onward evacuation and transfer of casualties repatriated within the home base.






Organisational Diagram (Battlefield)





The Regiment was reconstructed in April 1993 with the formation of the RLC, and is now tasked with the evacuation of casualties from Field Hospitals to rail or airheads within the FSG area. Tasking may also involve movement of casualties between hospitals by road directly back from the FSG to the RSG area.

161 Amb Regt is the only dedicated coach ambulance regiment in the British Army. On operations, it may exchange one of its two task squadrons with a squadron of Land Rover ambulances from 152 (Ulster) Amb Regt RLC(V), giving it the flexibility to fulfil its role as required by the operational situation.

THE FUTURE OF 161 AMB REGT RLC(V)

References:

INTRODUCTION

- 1. 161 Amb Regt RLC(V) is due to disband as part of Phase 2 of the implementation of TA restructuring following the SDR TA process. Reference A directed that the Regiment was to retain an operational capability until Apr 01 until replaced by a Regular unit. Reference B indicates that 161 Regt will disband in Oct 01¹. We believe that the original decision to disband this TA 3rd Line Amb Regt was predicated on the formation of a Regular 3rd Line Evacuation Regt under SDR Regular. Subsequently the capability was formed into 3 Evacuation Squadrons and split between the 3 Medical GS Regiments.
- 2. The disbandment of 161 Amb Regt is currently predicated on the formation of those Regular Army RAMC Regiments (4 GS, 5 GS and 6GS), by 1 Apr 01. Reference B indicates that 6 GS Regiment will not be fully formed until 2004. Phase 3 of the HQ LAND 3rd Line Medical Study, staffing of which is not yet complete, has yet to define the detailed requirements for the execution of provision of medical support and operational evacuation behind the divisional rear boundary.
- 3. 161 Amb Regt RLC(V) provides the following operational capability to HQ LAND:
 - a. <u>Evacuation Control Cell</u>. A trained Evacuation Control Cell for planning the deployment and regulation of evacuation assets across the theatre of operations.

b. Ambulance Support Groups (ASG). Up to 8 ASGs equipped with coach ambulances in support of evacuation from any medical facility. The unit can be task organised, by swapping assets with 152 Amb Regt, to give a balanced capability controlling both Ambulance Coaches and BattleField Ambulances.

CAPABILITIES

4. The Regiment is well recruited to 80% of its UE, is well trained and highly motivated. It provides its capability from the following established structure:

CONCERNS

5. I have 4 principal concerns regarding 161 Regt that could have an impact on the operational output delivered to LAND.

6. War Establishment Reserve (WER) Capability.

- a. It is not clear from where the WER will be found for those RLC Regular and TA personnel engaged in operational evacuation. The SDR TA process required the RLC to identify a WER element for most trades from its allocated TA headroom. e.g. 160 Transport Regt RLC(V) is a WER pool of 405 DROPS drivers.
- b. The War Fighting Increment (WFI) i.e. the difference between Unit Establishment (UE) and War Fighting Establishment (WFE) for 152 Amb Regt RLC(V) alone is 90 RLC soldiers. We estimate there is a requirement for a further WFI of 354 RLC personnel for Regular AMS units and a further 38 for TA AMS units. This makes a total of 482 WFI personnel required. The easy answer is that they could be found from individual reservists but there would be no guarantee that they would have any experience in the role. However, individuals in 161 Amb Regt are trained and experienced in the role and would be ideally suited to fill a proportion of these posts on mobilisation.
- c. Reference C highlights the need for Ambulance Crewmen to be trained to a higher standard than at present which adds weight to having at least some WER capability in the TA who are trained and focused on the role.

- 7. Evacuation Troops for Independent TA Units. There is some concern² that there will be difficulty in recruiting sufficient RLC Independent TA drivers to fill posts on the establishments of the Evacuation Squadrons in 4, 5 and 6 GS Med Regts especially as these units will, in some areas of the country, be in direct recruiting competition with RLC Independent Transport Regiments. 161 Regt, being a Specialist RLC TA unit, recruits from a nation-wide perspective and offers the flexibility of a reduced commitment and is therefore able to target a far wider population. There is an opportunity here to cover the shortfall for this capability either in the short term or long term with the formed capability in 161 Regt. There is scope to cadreize a number of the RLC driver posts within the Independent GS Med Regt Evacuation Sqns into 161 Amb Regt. These individuals would be held against the strength of the GS Med Regt and would train with them on exercises and deployments but would be part of the Specialist RLC TA based in Grantham.
- 8. <u>Command and Control for the ARRC Amb Gp</u>. Reference C and the ARRC CSS Force Proposal 2000 both articulate a requirement for an Ambulance Group HQ within the Medical Group. We assume that RHQ 152 Ambulance Regt will be allocated in support of the UK NSE (either on the first or second LOC or both!) and therefore it is not clear where the C2 and the Ambulance assets of the ARRC Amb Gp will come from. 161 Amb Regt is ideally suited and trained for this role.
- 9. <u>3rd Line Medical Study</u>. As the 3rd Line Medical Study is not yet complete, it is not clear what level of ambulance support will be required behind the divisional rear boundary and from where the support will be provided. As logisticians we have some concerns:
 - a. C2 of the evacuation process is already a complex business. The only organisation dedicated to this task is 152 Amb Regt who appear to be triple earmarked.
 - b. The new Medical Concept increases that complexity by placing a greater reliance on dispersed specialised medical facilities that will increase the lateral movement of casualties around the rear area.
 - c. Heavy reliance on Support Helicopter and by Tac Air may be false lessons drawn from PSO etc. This may not be sound for operations at a large scale of effort.
- 10. Does it make sense to disband this key capability before the conclusions from this Study have been drawn?

SUMMARY AND PROPOSAL

11. 161 Amb Regt RLC(V) exists, is well recruited and occupies a key position in the operational evacuation business. The complete capability that allowed for 161 Regt to be disbanded is not yet in place and the way ahead in this key area is not yet clear. Whilst the AMS is understandably reluctant to forgo TA headroom that they have allocated to surgical

capability to 'buy back' operational evacuation capability (both RLC/RAMC), they are nevertheless severely under recruited and are likely to remain so for some years.

- 12. It is therefore proposed that the disbandment of 161 Amb Regt be postponed for a period of 3 years until Apr 2004 and until Phase 3 of the HQ LAND 3rd Line Medical Study is delivered and its findings endorsed. The modest MTD funding for this highly capable unit could be found from the AMS under-recruited strength. In the interim the Army would retain a capability to:
 - a. Support newly formed but undermanned AMS TA units that have been unable to recruit evacuation troops.
 - b. Support UK AMS sponsored exercises with a trained manpower, a proven Amb Gp C2 structure and a trained Evacuation Control Cell.
 - c. Provide a robust and readily deployable WER capability containing RLC and RAMC personnel trained in evacuation.
 - d. Continue to provide evacuation 'expertise'. (e.g. It was 161 Amb Regt that LAND called on to carry out the recent stretcher restraint trials).
- 13. There is a real danger that the disbandment of 161 Amb Regt will result in the loss of a highly trained and motivated organisation that provides a cost effective but real operational utility to LAND Command. It would be very difficult to regenerate the capability provided by the Regiment after the unit has disbanded.


