If the photo is not possible to repair you will be informed and no charge made.






Membership

Back in January 2008, Ian Loftus began the task of attempting to locate all surviving members of the glorious Cutforth Platoon, for which the date of 14th September 1971 will, forever, be imprinted in their minds.

Thanks to the wonders of the internet and the help of Kev Sanders and Phil Wall, ably assisted by the Oracle known as Bill Chamberlain, various members were found, spread throughout England and, in the case of Nigel Hancock, Hungary (thought: Is this because no Deportation Treaty is in force between the UK and Hungary?)

After the initial reminiscing of times long past, a recurring theme kept being mentioned - "Wouldn't it be great to meet up again for a beer!" Geordie Pendleton, in what can only be put down as a moment of insanity, suggested April 19th at the Union Jack Club (UJC). Once those words consigned themselves to cyberspace everyone's attention was devoted to that date.

So dawned the fateful day. Geordie Pendleton, being a good ex-Staff Clerk had arrived on the Friday evening, so that he wouldn't be late, stood at the top of the steps of the UJC in order to greet the first arrivals. Charlie, unfortunately, was not staying overnight as he had to travel abroad, (to Scotland); departed with sincere and heartfelt wishes ringing in his ears.

After walking past various restaurants, Tony made the command decision to enter an Indian restaurant, whilst we all dutifully followed him. Again memories of yesteryear dominated the conversation and all too soon it was time to leave this establishment. At this point, Tony McIntyre went to stand up, but the chair refused to move. Next morning dawned, and having met at breakfast it was decided to pay a visit to the Imperial War Museum.

After an hour or so, Tony made his farewells, as he had left his wife packing the cases back home as he was going on holiday.
