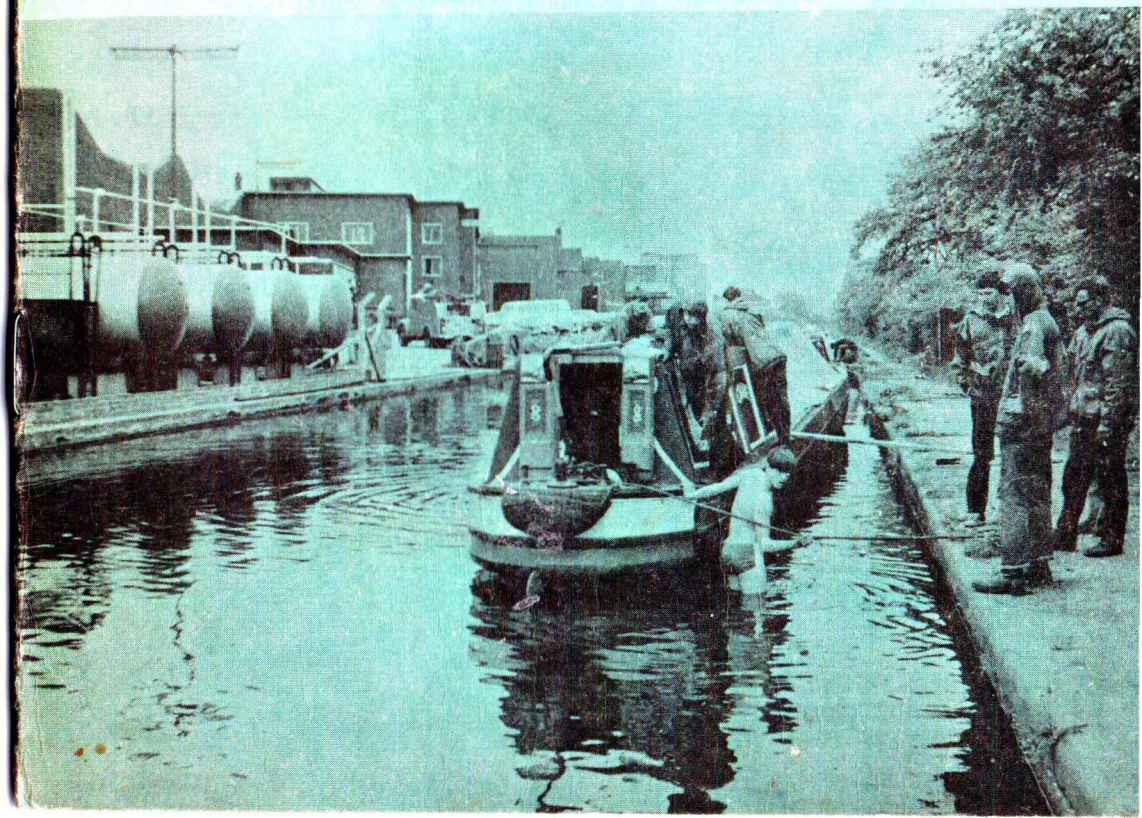

The Passing Out Platoon are distinguishable by their white waist belts.

By kind permission of the Director of Ordnance Services the Band of the Corps of the Royal Army Ordnance Corps will play at the Parade and later at the Prize-Giving.

THE FORM OF THE PASSING OUT PARADE

1. The Band and College march on to the Parade Ground and take up their positions.
2. The Inspecting Officer arrives at the Saluting Base.
3. The College presents arms and the band play the General Salute. (Spectators are requested to stand during the General Salute.)
4. The Junior Regimental Sergeant Major reports to the Inspecting Officer.
5. The Inspecting Officer inspects the Passing Out Platoon.
6. The College marches past in slow and then quick time
7. The College presents arms and the Band play the General Salute. (Spectators are again requested to stand.)
8. The Passing Out Platoon marches off the Parade Ground in slow time.
9. The remainder of the College and the Band march off the Parade Ground.

MAJOR T F PEARSON RAOC

Our Second-in-Command Major T F PEARSON will be leaving the College next term after two years sterling service. He is to take Command of a Supply Depot in Germany.

Commissioned into the Royal Warwickshire Regiment in 1942 Major PEARSON took part in the Italian Campaign and was at Anzio. He was a Prisoner of War from February 1944 until April 1945. After the War Major PEARSON transferred into the Royal Army Service Corps and subsequently joined the Royal Army Ordnance Corps.

Throughout the College many Officers and soldiers have benefitted from Major PEARSON's extensive military knowledge which has been supplemented with experience accrued in his raising four sons. His cheerful enthusiastic manner and wisdom in the way he has tackled all aspects of College life have inspired those with whom he has served.

COLLEGE DRUM MAJOR A WILLIAMSON RAOC

Sgt "DRUMMIE" WILLIAMSON after five years in the College leaves us this term for BAOR.

"Drummie" joined the Welsh Guards in 1946 as a fifteen year Boy Soldier and became a Drummer. A year later, "Drummie" transferred to the Corps of Drums of the Coldstream Guards with whom he took part in the *Trooping of the Colour*. "Drummie", together with three other Coldstream Guards Drummers, once took part in the late Billy COTTON's Band Show.

Sergeant WILLIAMSON who has served in Malaya, Germany, Kenya, and Aden, transferred to the Royal Army Ordnance Corps in 1965. A great measure of the success of the Battalion Corps of Drums is a reflection of his popularity and experienced instruction.

JUNIOR REGIMENTAL SERGEANT MAJOR I M LATCHEM

J RSM Ian Latchem who comes from Tiverton in Devon enlisted into the RAOC on 4th Sept 1967. He quickly rose through the ranks spending some time as J SGT of Hill Platoon. From this appointment he became Junior Company Sergeant Major of 'B' Company and then on the 5th April 1970 was promoted to Junior Regimental Sergeant Major. J RSM Latchem is an excellent shot winning the Crawford Tankard and the Best All Round shot awards. He plays many sports including Soccer. He is also the College Snooker Champion. He passed his trade examination as a storeman this term and has been posted to 24 OFP in Plymouth.

JUNIOR COMPANY SERGEANT MAJOR P R HOOD

J CSM Philip Hood comes from an excellent RAOC area, that of Bicester in Oxfordshire.

Before joining the College he attended Bicester Comprehensive School and since his arrival here has worked steadily towards his Army Certificate of Education Class 1, which he has now nearly completed.

Junior CSM Hood has represented the College at Soccer, Tennis and Full Bore Shooting and has been successful enough to pick up various medals in these events.

Having recently completed his Staff Clerks Course he is now heading for a "place in the sun", as his posting is to HQ Land Forces in Hong Kong.

J CSM Moran, who is probably one of the smallest Junior NCO's there ever has been comes from Durham. He spent the first four terms with Body Platoon, rising to the rank of Junior Sergeant. He is also the College Table Tennis Champion.

He has recently completed his training as a Staff Clerk, and was awarded the prize for the best Staff Clerk, and is posted to 5 OFP Barnard Castle.
