THE STAFF BAND OF THE ROYAL ARMY ORDNANCE CORPS

The music today is played by the Staff band. Originally this Band was formed from volunteer soldiers in 1921. In 1922 the nucleus of the present Corps Band was formed with the addition of 16 musicians mostly from the 3rd Battalion The Rifles Brigade.

In January 1939 the Band was officially recognized as established Staff Band of the British Army and the Bandmaster H.C. Jarman was appointed as Director of Music. In 1953 the Band moved to Blackdown.

The present Director of Music is Captain R.G Swift who first joined the Army as a pianist and clarinetist with the Royal Engineers Staff Band at Aldershot in 1960.

He was selected to attend the Student Bandmasters' Course at the Royal Military School of Music, Kneller Hall, in 1972.

On graduation he won eight major awards and was appointed Bandmaster to the Queens Royal Irish Hussars, with whom he served for five years in Paderborn, West Germany.

In 1979 he returned to Kneller Hall where he served for two years as School Bandmaster.

He was commissioned as Director of Music, The Light Division, in 1981, and was based at Winchester with the Headquarters Staff.

In November 1983 he received his present appointment as Director of Music, The Royal Army Ordnance Corps Staff Band.

The Band carries out an intensive programme of parades, concerts, dances, and many forms of official functions.

In recent years they have toured Germany, the Far and Middle East, West Indies, and Central and North America.

COLLEGE PERSONALITIES

LEUTENANT COLONAL DM. PUTT RAOC – COMMANDING OFFICER

Lieutenant Colonel Dan. Putt was born in Leigh, Lancashire on 2 December 1940 and was educated in Lancaster. He assumed the appointment as Commanding officer on 7 August 1981.

He joined the RAOC on commissioning from the Royal Military Academy Sandhurst in July 1961. Since that time he has served in Bahrain, France, Holland, Malaya, Northern Ireland and BAOR. He is a qualified Army parachutist and served in 16 Parachute Brigade.

On the academic side, he attended the Management Sciences Course at the University of Manchester Institute of Science and Technology where he gained a Diploma.

Lieutenant Colonel Putt has always taken an active interest in sport both as an organizer and a player. At Sandhurst he was awarded the Silver Bugle as athlete of the year and subsequently gained his Army Athletic Colours when he was the Army sprint champion. He has also represented the Army and his Corps at Rugby.

He is married and lives in Deepcut.
