

THE FORM OF THE PASSING OUT PARADE

- 1. The Band and College march on to the Parade Ground and take up their positions.
- 2. The Inspecting Officer arrives at the Saluting Base.
- 3. The College presents arms and the band play the General Salute. (Spectators are requested to stand during the General Salute.)
- 4. The Junior Regimental Sergeant Major reports to the Inspecting Officer.
- 5. The Inspecting Officer inspects the Passing Out Platoon.
- 6. The College marches past in slow and then quick time
- 7. The College presents arms and the Band play the General Salute. (Spectators are again requested to stand.)
- 8. The Passing Out Platoon marches off the Parade Ground in slow time.
- 9. The remainder of the Cellege and the Band march off the Parade Ground.

MAJOR T F PEARSON RAOC

Our Second-in-Command Major T F PEARSON will be leaving the College next term after two years sterling service. He is to take Command of a Supply Depot in Germany.

Commissioned into the Royal Warwickshire Regiment in 1942 Major PEARSON took part in the Italian Campaign and was at Anzio. He was a Prisoner of War from February 1944 until April 1945. After the War Major PEARSON transferred into the Royal Army Service Corps and subsequently joined the Royal Army Ordnance Corps.

Throughout the College many Officers and soldiers have benefitted from Major PEARSON's extensive military knowledge which has been supplemented with experience accrued in his raising four sons. His cheerful enthusiastic manner and wisdom in the way he has tackled all aspects of College life have inspired those with whom he has served.

COLLEGE DRUM MAJOR A WILLIAMSON RAOC

Sgt "DRUMMIE" WILLIAMSON after five years in the College leaves us this term for BAOR.

"Drummie" joined the Welsh Guards in 1946 as a fifteen year Boy Soldier and became a Drummer. A year later, "Drummie" transferred to the Corps of Drums of the Coldstream Guards with whom he took part in the *Trooping of the Colour*. "Drummie", together with three other Coldstream Guards Drummers, once took part in the late Billy COTTON's Band Show.
