

#### The Ex-Boys Association is on the move again...

A decision was made by the Association Committee, that the **XBA** website will become non-operational and **be opened to public viewing.** 

The **active** elements of the Association have now been moved to a Facebook Group.

We will continue to take Registrations, however we will only require the basic Service Details which will assist in the process of identifying and speeding up approval to the Facebook Group

Transfer of data (photos etc) onto the new Facebook Group will be completed by the end of April 2015.

The Facebook Group is open to all **RAOC**, **REME**, **RCT** (& **Intelligence Corps**) Ex Boys, Junior Leaders & Apprentices **who served at the establishments listed on the Association website.**

If you do not have a Facebook Account then you will need to create one by entering your email address and a password - then go to the Group using the above address or placing the Group name in the search box..

In addition to applying to join the Group we strongly suggest that if you have never Registered with the Association previously that you visit our website and complete the Registration Form (basic Service details) that will allow us to match your name against our Roll and speed up Facebook Group Membership approval.

We have been highly successful over the past 10 years or so and have revamped the website beyond recognition.

- Created a Newsletter that has been eagerly awaited by Members.
- Listed all the Platoon & House names and their History (including photos of their namesakes)
- Located over 2000 ex Boys with contact details
- Put hundreds of old Pals back in touch with each other.
- Had numerous well attended Reunions


# There are sections of the website that the Museum would give their saluting arm for and we believe the admin team should be justly proud of their achievements




#### Here in a nutshell are the reasons and plans for the move:

- When we needed younger recruits only Dave McCarthy & Ian Loftus came forward none were forthcoming to take over the major role of handling the website.
- Time had to come when we needed to review the situation and plan for the future without the "older" members of the admin team.
- With Social Media what it is and with a large contingent of ex Boys using Facebook and other sites, it was felt necessary to open up our own Group on Facebook.
- Transfer of various sections, as agreed, of our website to "Albums" on our Facebook Group and where possible.
- To use the Facebook Group as a News facility Reunions etc
- To reduce site running costs we have decided to change the format of how the site is run <u>in</u> <u>effect non-operational</u>.
- To take no further fees for membership to the Association after January 2015.
- To allow free viewing to all archived material once the website is "Closed"
- To reserve a proportion of our Cash to maintain the site over the next 10 years Viewing only.
- To archive all material on CD's for historical retention (possibly RCT/RAOC Museum?)

Finally we would like to extend our gratitude to all our Members, past & present, whose funds have allowed us to develop and improve the website over the past 10 years or so.

Our thanks also to all those who have contributed to the archives, by sending in material and memories, that has created an online record of Ex Boys service life far beyond our expectations.
