No doubt you may be aware that we continue in our search of RAOC relatedtems/Regalia of any kind. We have just acquired an Service Dress jacket and SD Cap (in use up until 1961), the Bandsman jacket, wings, white music pouch and belt(both in white buff leather) together with a number of the Blue cloth Service Helmets and plates. An RAOC ceremonial flag, RAOC Boys Training Wing rope tensioned Drum a Junior Leaders Drum together with an Army Apprentice Rod Tensioned side drum. Four silver plated Bugles, two brass bugles. The treasure of the collection must be the Drum Majors Sash, sword belt, sword and gloves.

We have also acquired a Jacket belt and drum majors sash for the RAOC Staff Band.

We have also a number of RAOC uniforms ranging from a Brigadier, Colonel, Major, Captain and Lieutenants down to a Sergeant's number two dress tunic.





