THE INSPECTING OFFICER

Lieutenant-General Sir Terence McMeekin KCB OBE

Terence Douglas Herbert McMeekin was born in September 1918 in Shanghai, China, son of the late Herbert William Porter McMeekin of Cogry, County Antrim. He was educated at King William's College, Isle of Man, and the Royal Military Academy, Woolwich, from which he was commissioned into the Royal Artillery in August 1938.

After war service in Malta and in North Africa and Sicily with the 8th Army when he was mentioned in despatches, he became Brigade Major, Royal Artillery 1st Airborne Division at the end of 1944 and later served as a battery commander in 6th Airborne Division in Palestine in 1945/46.

Following a staff course in gunnery, he became an instructor at the School of Artillery, Manorbier, from 1947 to 1950; he then served in Germany in 3rd Regiment Royal Horse Artillery and later on the staff. He attended the Joint Services Staff College in 1955 and, after further service in Germany with the 5th Regiment Royal Horse Artillery, was appointed AA and QMG in Hong Kong from 1958 to 1960.

His command of the 29th Field Regiment followed, both in Britain and in the Kuwait operation; he later converted this regiment into a Commando Regiment RA - the Army's first Commando unit since their disbandment at the end of the war. He was posted to the School of Artillery, Larkhill, as Chief Instructor Tactics from 1962 to 1964 with the rank of Colonel; and then promoted to Brigadier to command the 28 Commonwealth Infantry Brigade Group in Malaysia in October 1964, when it was engaged in dealing with the Indonesian confrontation.

He was Director of Public Relations (Army) at the Ministry of Defence from March 1967 to May 1968 and in July 1968 he became General Officer Commanding 3 Division, with the rank of Major General.

In September 1970 he took over as the last Commandant of the Joint Services Staff College. When this closed in August 1971 he was responsible for launching, in its place, our new National Defence College, becoming its first Commandant.

At the begining of December 1972, General McMeekin became General Officer Commanding South East District, Aldershot, with the rank of Lieutenant General.

General McMeekin became an Officer of the Order of the British Empire in January 1960, a Companion of the Order of the Bath in January 1972 and in January 1973 he became a Knight Commander of the Order of the Bath.

He is married and has three children. His home is at Beverstone near Tetbury in Gloucestershire and his mother, Mrs JK McMeekin, lives in Farnham, Surrey.

THE FORM OF THE PASSING OUT PARADE

1. The Corps of Drums march on.
2. The Corps of Drums give a display of marching and playing.
3. The Corps of Drums march off.
4. A PT display is given.
5. The Band and College march on to the Parade Ground and take up their positions.
6. The Inspecting Officer arrives at the Saluting Base.
7. The College presents arms and the Band play the General Salute. (Spectators are requested to stand during the General Salute, officer spectators do not salute.)
8. The Apprentice Regimental Sergeant Major reports to the Inspecting Officer.
9. The Inspecting Officer inspects the Passing Out Platoons.
10. The College marches past in slow and then quick time.
11. The Passing Out Platoons march off the Parade Ground, whilst remainder of parade present arms.
12. The remainder of the College and the Band march off the Parade Ground.

COLLEGE PERSONALITIES

Major JH Rose RAOC

Major Rose was commissioned from the Royal Military Academy Sandhurst in February 1955. A tour as a Platoon Commander in 1 Regular Training Battalion was followed by service in field force and base units in BAOR. He joined the Army in 1954, enlisting in the now disbanded Royal Army Service Corps and joined the Royal Army Ordnance Corps in 1965. His trade as Staff Clerk took him first to Norway, followed by a tour at the Ministry of Defence. After that a nine year spell of overseas tours followed, apart from a few months at Edinburgh Castle, which saw him in Germany (twice), Cyprus, Malta and the USSR.
